hese days, life is becoming very complicated. In the past, things like climate change, global warming, resource depletion, and overpopulation weren't important. Economic development has always been the most important thing. However, as sea levels continue to rise, Carbon Dioxide (CO2) in the atmosphere increases, rainforests disappear, and more species face extinction, environmental change becomes a reality that will affect all of us. It will affect our children most of all. Climatologists believe that people are directly responsible for it. For example, the burning of fossil fuels like gasoline, natural gas, and coal (in our cars and power plants) releases CO2 causing the polar ice caps to melt, causing sea levels to rise by 3 meters by the year 2050 and 6 meters by the year 2100. This means that cities like New York, Washington. Bombay, London, and of course, Tokyo will be underwater in less than 40 years from now. Most climatologists believe that the damage to the environment can't be reversed, but if we make drastic changes in our lifestyles now it is possible to delay humankind's extinction. There are many simple things you can do in your daily lives to help:

Install solar panels on your house. The Japanese government will help pay for solar panels to be installed on your roof. This will reduce your "carbon footprint" greatly. Stop using disposable chopsticks. Cutting down trees for "waribashi" causes desertification, landslides, greater CO2 emissions, and that yellow sand on your car every morning. Shut off lights and appliances at home and work. Unplug your T.V. when you're not using it. Conservation of electricity is very important. Drive less. Buy a bicycle. Take public transportation, Carpool, Walk, Hybrid cars are good on gas, but still have many negative environmental impacts.

Save water. As Earth warms, we will have more droughts, and drinking water will evaporate. That means no more baths! Become a vegetarian. Cow, pig. and chicken farming create 12% of annual CO2 and 23% of methane emissions. You should buy locally grown fruit and vegetables only, and grow your own at home if possible. Stop eating tuna. Blue fin tuna will be extinct by 2012 unless we stop fishing now. Scientists also believe that the ocean will have no fish by 2100. Stop using PET bottles, plastic bags, and products that are over-packaged. Most plastic from Japan goes into the ocean, or is shipped to China who burns it to make electricity.

Environmental change is not just the future, it's happening now. We need to understand that we don't inherit the Earth from our ancestors; in fact, we take it from our children. Let's try to leave them a small piece of it.
