ne of the biggest fears of a company - no matter how big or small it may be - is the fear of being audited by the Internal Revenue Service, more commonly known as the IRS. Being audited is a grueling experience. What happens when you get audited is, basically you are accused of not being on the "up and up" and that in some way you have "cooked the books". The process is an intrusive one that puts you and your staff "through the wringer" both emotionally and physically. Even with small companies the audit process can take weeks. What makes it even more painful is that you must compensate the IRS by paying the salary of the IRS employee who is trying to find something you did wrong and even if the IRS auditor finds nothing wrong with your records and says everything balances out just fine, you still have to pay the IRS for this.

The IRS auditor goes through every record, every cash receipt, and all financial records that you have kept with a "fine tooth and comb" and recalculates everything that your accountant did (who you already paid a "boatload of money" to), and they do it in your office. Having an IRS employee in your company's financial records department puts everyone on "pins and needles" and thus creates a difficult atmosphere to do even the normal work routine.

So, how do you avoid getting audited by the government? Or at least minimizing the damage done by them when they leave? The answer is quite simple; like anything else in life you should always have some "reserves" left over. This is the same concept as when totaling your savings or investments. You should always have an emergency fund/account that you don't count or include in your totals, as a "just in case" fund. By the same token, never claim every expense. You should keep at least 10 percent of expenses unclaimed. This way if you do have to suffer at the hands of the IRS, after they're done with you they will be owing you money. This is something the IRS doesn't like to do and will certainly remember the next time they even think about auditing you.
